

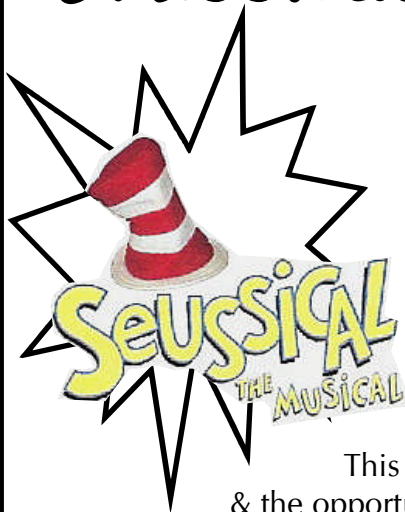

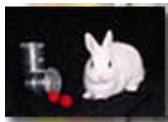

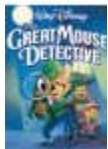

The Great Mouse Detective

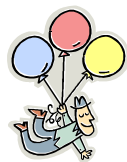

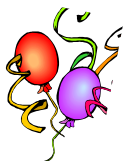

MURDER MYSTERY GAME

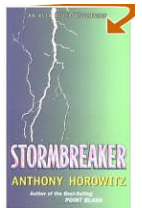

Toddler Summer Reading Club is for children Birth through 3 years of age. During the Mother Goose Storytimes, we will model reading behaviors for parents/caregivers and children that emphasize the importance of reading to the very young. Each week we will highlight and practice one of the early literacy skills. Registration begins Monday, June 18.

Week 1

Narrative Skills:

Tell stories together, encourage pretend play, & let your child be a storyteller.

Week 2

Letter Knowledge:

Help your child identify the first letters in his/her name & find it in books, on street signs or on package labels.

Week 3

Print Awareness:

Help your child discover how to hold a book & turn the pages.

Week 4

Vocabulary:

Teach your child specific names of things, like vegetables at the grocery store.

Week 5

Print Motivation:

Find books that speak to your child's interests & share them often.

Week 6

Phonological Awareness:

Sing songs, play games & share rhymes to help your child play with smaller sounds in words.
