Behind the Desk.....

The library staff is happy to say good bye to 2008 and hello to 2009. There were a lot of ups and downs in 2008 for us; however, we hope some of the issues the library dealt with in 2008 are truly behind us.

We started 2008 and ended 2008 with a flooded library. On January 5, 2008 we were flooded with 1,200 gallons of water flowing in through the front door. The good news is that drainage improvements have been made. New drain lines,

sump pumps and an entry way concrete pad that slopes slightly away from the front door were installed in October. We know that they work because of the November 26 flood. The front entry improvements performed as expected. Unfortunately, some drainage issues related to the construction of the expansion did not. 12,000 gallons of water flood into the library from the north side of the expansion through the emergency exit, into the children's room and out onto the main floor. Those problems have since been repaired. We appreciate the patience of our library patrons during the closures that were required in order to clean up the library.

We celebrated the groundbreaking for the new expansion to the children's room June 16, 2008. Construction started June 30th and was completed by the end of December. The expansion will be used for story times, crafts, events and meetings. The room is beautiful! On the west wall are lovely metal sculptures of California oak trees with the hands of community members adorning the trees as leaves. Local artist Conrad Brazzel created the trees and hands, and donated his labor for this fundraising project to benefit our children's department. Once you see it, you may want to add your hand to one of the treesthere is still time to participate and it is tax deductible.

Mirroring the larger environment, the library did feel the economic impact of recession in 2008. Fundraising income was down, the library's general fund budget was reduced and open staff positions were frozen.

Use of the library's services and programs increased this past year however, following a national trend. We are glad you did take advantage of what we offer! As taxpayers, you support your public library and we are there for you when you need us-in good times and in tough times.
